


# Skilled, Innovative and Diverse Workforce and Universities MELBOURNE, VICTORIA

Victoria is the premier location for commercially orientated graduates, which ensures investors have the best talent available to get the job done. It also has a diverse multicultural population, providing a strong multilingual workforce for internationally oriented businesses.

Australians generate the highest amount of GDP per person in the Asia-Pacific region, and is ranked fifth globally. It is ranked in the top ten countries in the world for education, also ranking highly in terms of its universities meeting the needs of a competitive economy<sup>1</sup>.

Melbourne is serviced by ten world-class universities, providing industry with a constant stream of highly skilled graduates<sup>2</sup>. With over a quarter of Victorians having a Bachelors degree or above and, with over half obtaining some form of post-school qualification<sup>3</sup> industry is constantly supplied with a highly capable workforce.

In 2014, Melbourne was recognised as the **top Major City in Human Capital and Lifestyle** in fDi Magazine's Global Cities of the Future 2014/2015 Report, with high rankings in categories such as: number of universities; tertiary students as a percentage of population; labour force as a percentage of population; education expenditure and many more.

In 2013, Victoria had the highest number of IT, Natural and Physical Science, Engineering, Management and Commerce graduates. University graduates in these areas underpin Melbourne's ability to continually generate new ideas and adapt to and adopt emerging technologies.

# Melbourne's universities are internationally recognised

The quality, reputation and innovation of Melbourne's university system are globally recognised. In 2014-15 the Times Higher Education Supplement ranked The University of Melbourne:

- 13th in Clinical, Pre-clinical and Health
- 19th in Arts and Humanities
- 19th in Social Sciences
- 29th in the world in Life Sciences
- 30th in the world in Physical Sciences
- 37th in the world in Engineering & IT

These rankings place this leading research institution ahead of global players such as Dartmouth, Brown University and New York University.

The quality of a Melbourne university education has long been accepted by the international community. In 2015, the Melbourne was ranked as the second Best Student City in the world by the QS Best Student City Rankings.

Victorian universities offer world-class research and courses in the following areas:

# Melbourne is a leader in research

Australia ranked in the top 12% of countries in the 2013 Global Innovation Index, and many of its leading research facilities are based in Melbourne. Facilities such as the Australian Synchotron, and the Victorian Life Sciences Computation Initiative deliver breakthroughs with wide ranging applications. Melbourne also attracts more than forty percent of Australia's Medical Research Funding.

Victoria is home to thirteen internationally recognised medical research institutions and fourteen agricultural research centres, and research excellence at Victorian universities also means industry has access to global thought leaders.

### International students in Victoria


